

The Constitution of the Multicultural Club

Article I: Name

The Name of this organization shall be The Multicultural Club

Article II: Purpose

The purpose of The Multicultural Club will be to explore and promote an increased understanding of the various cultures of the world among the students of Lorain County Community College. Members of the Club will have the opportunity to better their leadership abilities through their participation. The Club will collaborate with other clubs, as well as the faculty, teachers, and students of this college to achieve these ends. The activities of the Club will extend beyond the college to the community.

Article III: Membership

Section 1: General Membership

Membership in the Multicultural club is open to any student of Lorain County Community College or any student attending classes at Lorain County Community College through the University Partnership Program

Section 2: Voting Members

- a. Voting Members must attend classes at Lorain County Community College or through the University Partnership Program and, in addition, must have attended at least two prior meetings of the Multicultural Club, one of which is a meeting held on either of the two weeks directly preceding the meeting on which voting will take place, and be registered for membership.
- b. Voting Members may participate in any electoral procedures of the Club.

Article IV: Meetings

Section 1: General Meetings

General meetings will be held weekly for all officers and members of the Club, at a time and day designated by the Club.

Section 2: Additional Meetings and Club Activities

- a. The Club will call additional meetings as deemed necessary.
- b. All Club activities and meetings will be held during the course of the school year.

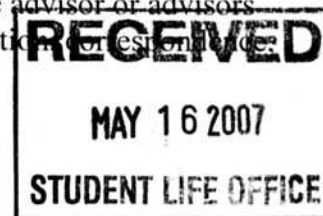
Article V: Activities

The Club will hold or sponsor frequent activities or events. These may include field excursions, business and community projects, and the attendance of guest speakers. Members will be encouraged to participate in a variety of Club activities.

Article VI: Advisors

The Multicultural Club must have at least one member of the faculty of Lorain County Community College occupying a position within the Club as advisor. The advisor or advisors must be consulted before the Club carries through any official documentation or expenditures.

Article VII: Officers

The executive members of the Multicultural Club will include the following: President, Vice-President, Treasurer, Secretary, and Student Senate Representative.

Section 1: President

The President will facilitate the meetings and all communication within the college and its clubs and organizations, as well as any organizations outside of the college. The President will work closely with the Club's members, officers, and advisors. He or she will be the initial contact with the advisors.

Section 2: Vice-President

The Vice-President will hold secondary responsibilities to those of the President or any responsibilities as delegated by the President. In the event the President is absent from a meeting or function, the Vice-President will chair that meeting or function.

Section 3: Treasurer

The Treasurer will have the fiscal responsibility of reporting and maintaining accurate financial records of the Club. He or she will work with Student Life as appropriate regarding the finances of the Club.

Section 4: Secretary

The Secretary will have the fiscal responsibility of keeping accurate records of membership, the minutes of general meetings, and supervising formal correspondence and any written documentation of the Club.

Section 5: Student Senate Representative

One member, chosen on a volunteer basis, will represent the Multicultural Club at meetings of the Student Senate.

Article VIII: Elections

Elections will be held at the end of each spring semester for officers for the following year. The term for each of the officer positions will last one school year. Officers will call special elections to fill any vacancies in Club office or any new positions that may be formed. Any other elections may be called as deemed necessary by the Club.

Article IX: Amendments

Amendments will be made when necessary by a two-thirds majority vote of voting members. Petitions may be submitted in writing for amendments one month before the amendment may take effect.
