Constitution of the NEOSA– LCCC Student Chapter Organization

Article I. Name

Section 1. The name of this organization shall be NEOSA-LCCC Student Chapter

Article II. Purpose

Section 1. The specific purpose of the NEOSA-LCCC Student Chapter is to promote the interaction of students with interests in information technology and computer related issues of concern to Lorain County Community College/University Partnership students.

Article III. Membership

Section 1: General Membership

Membership in the NEOSA-LCCC Student Chapter Organization is open to any student attending Lorain County Community College (LCCC), as well as, University Partnership (UP) students. The cost of membership fees will be determined by the majority vote of the NEOSA-LCCC Student Chapter each year.

Section 2: Voting Members

- a. To vote, a member must be a member in good standing.
- b. A member is in good standing by enrolling in at least one class at LCCC or UP submitting their name to the chapter president and paying the dues.
- c. A roster of voting members must be maintained by the chapter President.

Article IV: Meetings

Section 1. Meetings dates will be determined at the beginning of each semester. The tentative first meeting of the semester will be set by the NEOSA-LCCC Student Chapter in the prior semester.

Article V: Activities

Section 1. There will be events held during the year. These will be announced and open to all NEOSA-LCCC Student Chapter members in good standing and announced at regularly held meetings. There will also be additional information emailed to NEOSA-LCCC Student Chapter members.

Article VI: Advisors

Section 1. The NEOSA-LCCC Student Chapter will have one faculty/staff advisor.

Article VII: Officers

Section 1. The student chapter will have two acting offices; the President and Vice President. These officers must be members in good standing. The President and Vice President will be elected by the body of the members in good standing.

Article IIX. Elections

Section 1. The President and Vice President position will last a duration (1) year and will be determined via election. The election will take place the first semester of each year. Only members in good standing will be eligible to vote. The ballots will be tallied and the past President will announce the new President and Vice President elect.

Article IX: Amendments

Section 1. Amendments are approved at special meetings only. Special meetings for amendments will be announced at least two weeks in advance. Only members in good standing can vote. An amendment is approved by a 2/3 vote of the members attending the special meeting.
