

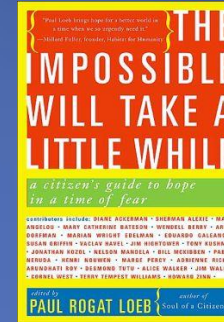
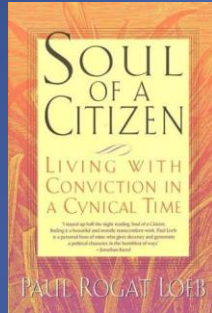


# Constitution Day Event!
