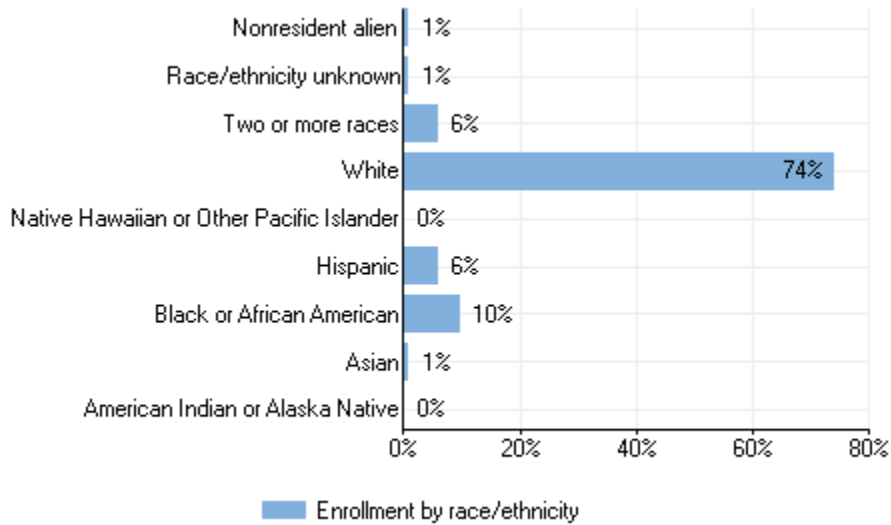
Completion-Graduation Rates

1. The school annually must prepare the completion or graduation rate of its certificate or degree-seeking, first-time, full-time undergraduate students.
 - a. 2010 Cohort Graduation rate 100% time- 1%
 - b. 2010 Cohort Graduation rate 150% time- 10%
 - c. 2010 Cohort Graduation rate 200% time- 15%
2. If the school determines that its mission includes providing substantial preparation for students to enroll in another eligible school it must prepare the transfer-out rate of its certificate or degree-seeking, first-time, full-time undergraduate students.
 - a. 2010 Cohort 20%
3. If the school offers a predominant number of its programs based on semesters, trimester, or quarters it must base its completion or graduation rate, retention rate, and if applicable, transfer-out rate calculations, on the cohort of certificate or degree-seeking, first-time, full-time undergraduate students who enter the school during the fall term of each year.
