

## Student-Right-To-Know Act

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In compliance with the Student Right-To-Know Act, these rates are limited to a cohort of students which are tracked for three-year period, defined as first-time, full-time, degree or certificate seeking students. Lorain County Community College provides the following information regarding its graduation/completion and transfer-out rates. Source: IPEDS

*(Please note that these rates do not include information about the majority of LCCC students)*

**Completion-Graduation Rates** – These rates are calculated as the total number of first-time full-time completers within 100%, (Associate’s: 2-Year) 150% (3-Year) and 200% (4-Year) of normal time divided by the total cohort.

- a. 2013 Cohort Graduation rate 100% time - 7%
- b. 2013 Cohort Graduation rate 150% time - 19%
- c. 2012 Cohort Graduation rate 200% time - 20%

**Retention Rates** – 67% of the first-time, full-time undergraduate students who enrolled in the Fall of 2015 returned in the Fall of 2016. The part-time student retention rate was 37%.

**Graduation Rates (Disaggregated)** – these rates are for the 2013 cohort at 150% time normal time. (3 – Years for 2-Year Programs)

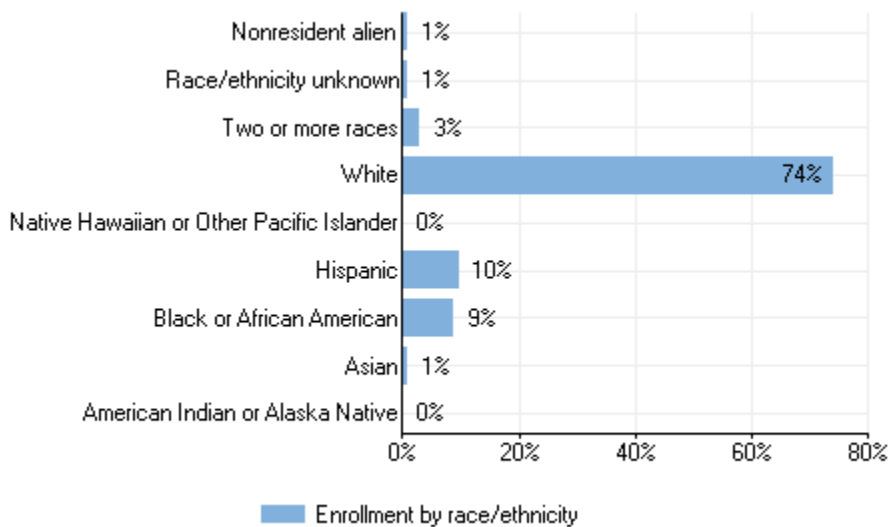
**Transfer-Out Rate** – For the 2013 cohort the transfer-out rate is 19%. A student is included in the Transfer-Out rate if, within the three-year tracking period, they transferred to another postsecondary institution prior to receiving a certificate or degree from LCCC.
