Educational Leadership

The graduate program offered by the Ashland University College of Education through the LCCC University Partnership is designed to provide functionally integrated academic, experimental and field-based study necessary to the personal and professional growth of educators.

Toward this end, the program includes four distinct components: a common core of studies focusing on the foundations of education, program courses in educational leadership organized around instructional leadership and organizational management, an administrative internship and an inquiry seminar capstone experience.

Upon completion of the MED in Educational Leadership, students transition to the Educational Administration Licensure program. Six hours of coursework in the Administrative Licensure program is required to acquire building principal or curriculum, instruction, and professional development licensure.

Admission and Application Information

Regular admission procedures are based on evidence of the following: Completed Application for Admission form; \$30 application fee; official transcript showing a bachelor's degree from an accredited university; cumulative grade-point average of 2.75 or above (4.0 system) or a minimum GPA of 3.0 (a minimum of 12 graduate semester hours).

Curriculum
