### Special Notes:

Students need a minimum C/2.0 grade in each of the following courses: CMMC 151 (COMM 15000), ENGL 162 (ENG 21011), MTHM 171 (MATH 110100 and MGMT 44299).

Students planning to earn dual degrees, Associate of Arts and Associate of Applied Business, should consult with as LCCC advisor about LCCC General Electives in order to complete the AAB Management or AAB in Human Resources.

Students planning to earn multiple degrees should declare this intent early with Financial Aid in order to have their General Electives covered under a declared degree plan.

\*Students wanting to earn a second AAB or One Year Technical Certificate should consult an advisor about Technical Elective options.

\*\*Kent will not accept transfer credit for FNCE 251 or BADM 255. Students may take these courses as preparation for Kent courses but Kent will still require students to take FIN 36053 and HRM 34180 with Kent. These courses taken with Kent will transfer back to LCCC and grant credit for FNCE 251 and BADM 255, fulfilling requirements for the AAB.

^Students must successfully complete one domestic and one global course to meet Kent Core requirements. These courses are noted below by a "D" or "G" notation. LCCC requires three Arts & Humanities and three Social Science choices from two disciplines for completion of LCCC General Education requirements. Some of these choices may also fulfill the Kent domestic and global diversity course choices. These requirements may also be met through a student's choice of elective courses.
