- Courses indicated with (**) are a note that student may choose four courses (12 credit hours) at the 3000/4000 level as an alternative to choosing three additional ALS Topical Seminar courses, which are ALS 3040: Social Sciences, ALS 3050: Humanities, and ALS 3060: Natural Sciences.
- Beginning with Fall Semester 2022, the [Liberal Studies program](#) of University College will be offered in the Competency Based Education (CBE) modality. CBE offers several, distinct advantages to students:
 - No weekly deadlines!
 - Work can be done at any pace if 70% is completed by the end of Week 10.
 - Up to three attempts to master the competencies in each module.
 - Work individually with course instructor on academic questions/concerns.
 - CBE course mentor to assist with non-academic questions and staying on track.

- o CBE will allow students to complete the required competencies in each seminar at the pace that best suits them - as quickly as possible, or over the fifteen weeks of the semester. It is unique because students can pause or accelerate throughout the semester when "life happens". Students receive feedback on their progress and ongoing support from the course instructor and course mentor to help ensure success.
